The Jamaica Dental Mission (JDM) is an annual dental mission trip based out of Montego Bay. JDM was founded in 2000 by Dr. Dwight McLeod, a Jamaican dentist who graduated from Howard University and is a professor at Southern Illinois University. Every year in July,

a group of volunteers consisting of dentists, pharmacists, and students set up clinics in the underserved communities of Kew Park, Cambridge, and Flankers. Dental services provided include extractions, cleanings, fillings, root canals, sealants, and denture repairs.

This was my 4th consecutive year attending JDM. I started in 2012 as a dental student, and this year I accepted the responsibility of overseeing the Cambridge clinic as a lead dentist. This year, a total of 38 students, 14 dentists, 3 dental hygienists, 3 pharmacists, and 14 other volunteers all contributed to the mission being a great success, as we were able to treat 1,138 patients in the 4 days of clinic operations. It gives me a great sense of pride to not only help guide the students in their training, but also to provide service to so many Jamaicans who would not have access to dental care otherwise.

Over the years, JDM has seen a growing trend of performing more fillings and cleanings instead of extractions, with a particular focus on helping young children keep their new permanent teeth. This trend

is due to the introduction of several high speed drills and ultrasonic cleaning devices at each clinic. This is an important trend which I hope to continue in the years to come.


One long-term goal of JDM is to build a new clinic in Kew Park (where JDM originated) in order to give the Jamaican people year-round access to dental care, rather than just the 4 days a year we are there. This is a lofty goal which will require a significant amount of time, effort, and resources. 



PROJECT 2014 AND BEYOND.... SAVE THE FOOD AND NUTRITION LABS



“How important is the FN programme at ICHS? Your little sisters who just began their high school life this September would already have met the FN labs. It is a compulsory subject for students in grades 7 and 9 (first and third forms). At the barest minimum they learn the importance of nutrition and the need to make healthy choices.” Sr. Angella.

We have been working diligently to get this project off the ground but like a young bird learning to fly we have been off to a slow start and like that young bird, with your help, we will eventually soar.

Since we first heard of the need for the upgrade of the Food and Nutrition Labs at ICHS in 2013 the condition of the labs continue to deteriorate - More cupboard doors are missing, more Formica is lifted, more tiles are cracked, fewer sinks are working. Nonetheless the students continue to produce excellent work with what they have... what an amazing life lesson... Well why doesn't the Government help we ask... because ICHS is an elite school and there are many schools with far greater needs than the updating of the food and nutrition labs so we need to help...

Progress update

Through one of the members of our executive we were able to contact an alumna in Jamaica, Architect Guila Bernal who has kindly accepted the challenge of designing a new Food and Nutrition Lab. The original blue prints for the current labs have been located and are now in Guila's capable hands. We anticipate receiving the design in due course. Once we have the design, we will then need to consult a quantity surveyor to give us an estimate of the overall cost which will become our target.




